NO CABINET DECISION MADE ON THE SALE OF SUBANG AIRPORT

Much has been said and reported in the media regarding a purported proposal to sell Sultan Abdul Aziz Shah, Subang Airport (LTSAAS) in part or as a whole.

Per the Ministry's statement on 7 May 2021, the Government does not bar external parties from submitting proposals to redevelop existing projects or develop new assets.

However, **NO DECISION** has been made by the Cabinet to approve any proposal to sell any part of LTSAAS to the private sector, as alleged by certain quarters.

The operating rights as well as rights under the Leased Agreement granted to Malaysia Airports Holdings Berhad (MAHB) to operate, manage and maintain including to occupy, use and control LTSAAS remain valid until 2034 and 2067 respectively. MAHB is responsible to develop LTSAAS as an international aerospace hub as per the Cabinet decision of 2 March 2005. No decision has been made to alter this condition.

The Government understands and reiterates that great care and deliberation are needed before any final decision is made regarding a significant strategic public asset that affects thousands of Malaysians, such as LTSAAS. The public is urged to cease propagating further misinformation on this matter or action will be taken against the parties responsible.
