The KLIA Aeropolis is a massive airport city project to turn KLIA into a world-class airport city. Also present at the event were Malaysia Airports chairman Tan Sri Dr Wan Abdul Aziz Wan Abdullah and Civil Aviation Department director-general Datuk Seri Azharuddin Abdul Rahman.

The KLIA Awards was first introduced in 2006. Winners of this year's awards were chosen based on their 2015 achievement in sectors such as passenger movements, growth factor, sales performance, international recognition and service excellence.
